





North Buckhead Neighborhood Master Plan

NBCA and Council Member Howard Shook sponsored the development of the North Buckhead Neighborhood Master Plan. TSW, a renowned planning and design firm, prepared the Master Plan, completing the plan in 2015. North Buckhead is the only neighborhood in the city to have

developed a professional Master Plan. Subsequently, the Master Plan was adopted by the Atlanta City Council and incorporated into the City's Comprehensive Development Plan. That means that zoning applications and other policies and proposals are in part judged for their conformance to the Master Plan. However, it does not guarantee funding for projects in the Master Plan. That requires further advocacy and creativity. Many of the ideas in this publication had their origin in the Master Plan and, in turn, the Master Plan will be periodically updated as we continue to expand our vision and initiatives for North Buckhead.

The B-Line Bicycle Network

The North Buckhead Neighborhood Master Plan envisions an extensive network of bike lanes totaling over ten miles. Dubbed the 'B-Line,' NBCA is now working to make this network a reality.

Great for Getting Around

The B-Line will have many connectivity benefits for cyclists. It will make it easier to get to:

- Path 400, and all the things that Path 400 connects to, including, eventually, the Beltline
- Sarah Smith School (both campuses)
- Downtown Buckhead and its many shops & restaurants
- Local shops and restaurants on Roswell Road

The B-Line will also have many community benefits. Even those who never ride a bike will benefit from the way that the B-Line will help calm traffic. The B-Line creates narrower automobile lanes that naturally reduce average speeds. The B-Line also increases the number of crosswalks, further slowing traffic. On top of all that, the sight of bike lanes and people using them makes drivers slow down even more. It's all about calming traffic by creating neighborhoodfriendly streets.

The B-Line is Already 50% Complete

Of the entire ten-mile B-Line network, the City has already installed bike lanes on Old

To complete the B-Line, we will work with the city to create detailed engineering drawings, paint the lanes, and install additional signage. We also want to devise a plan for keeping the bike lanes clear of debris on an ongoing basis. We will be working closely with our elected city officials and city staff to make

Gateways to North Buckhead

We are proud of our neighborhood and want the most traveled entrances into our community to represent the beauty that lies within. We are currently working on landscape plans for one major entrance and starting to brainstorm what could be done at other neighborhood entrances.

North Buckhead Park & Roundabout

The City of Atlanta and the Buckhead Community Improvement District (BCID) are planning a roundabout at the intersection of Wieuca Road and Phipps Boulevard, as described in previous NBCA newsletters. As part of the roundabout's installation, North Buckhead Park, adjacent to the intersection, will undergo a complete renovation.

The City and BCID have asked NBCA to help devise and approve the landscape design for the roundabout and the new North Buckhead Park.

The park will function as a pass-through space, not a space where people will spend hours of time. North Buckhead's other parks already serve that role in a wonderful variety of ways. Our hope is that pedestrians will find delightful moments to pause as they WALK through, perhaps to admire the beauty of the plantings, capture a view (or a selfie!) with a striking sculpture in the roundabout, or chat with a friend.

Horticulturally, the landscape plan will be an 'Ode to the Piedmont' featuring a showcase of native plants. As a gateway, the greenspace will create a transition between the urban excitement of Downtown

Buckhead and the forested natural beauty of our single-family residential area. As public art, the roundabout will feature a dramatic sculptural element specifically commissioned for the park.

We expect design approval by the end of the year and project completion sometime in 2022.

Other Entrances

We are just starting the process of developing ideas for other entrances to North Buckhead, including at Wieuca and Roswell and on Old Ivy at Habersham. The design of these other entrances and of other improvements within North Buckhead will most likely follow the design approach at North Buckhead Park.

Let's Make Wieuca Our Signature Street

One big idea for North Buckhead is to make Wieuca our signature street.

Why is Wieuca so important?
Well, for starters, Wieuca is our single longest street. It connects us to Downtown Buckhead at one end and to Roswell Road at the other end. Whether one is going to a fancy restaurant in Downtown Buckhead or going to a quickserve restaurant on Roswell Road, it's the way to get there. Along the way, Wieuca connects with 17 of North Buckhead's neighborhood streets, Path 400, and Sarah Smith's new campus.

It's also an historic street. It's on all the old maps. Was it really named by an early local leader for his three daughters Wilma, Eunice, and Catherine? Some say yes, some say no. But it's the story that we're going with. The remains of an old grist mill, the mill pond, and a spillway are still visible just above where Little Nancy Creek flows into Nancy Creek.

Wieuca is our neighborhood's favorite walking, running, and



bicycling route. It's hard to go for a walk or jog on Wieuca and not see several neighbors that you know. For bicycling, it sports two recently widened bike lanes. It's our Main Street. And it's a huge priority to make it as accommodating as possible.

Unfortunately, its convenience as a thoroughfare is not lost on literally thousands of cut-through commuters every day. Slowing them down so that they can enjoy the ride and we can enjoy our neighborhood is another huge priority.

So how do we make Wieuca our signature street and encourage commuters to slow down and respect our neighborhood?

There are lots of ideas:

- Neighborhood Gateways
- Additional sidewalks
- A landscaping program
- Keeping the bike lanes& sidewalks free of debris

- Banners
- Attractive neighborhood& functional signage
- Lower speed limit
- Camera-based ticketing at Sarah Smith
- Raised crosswalks
- Flashing lights at crosswalks
- Additional radar speed signs
- Signature streetscape elements (drive through Ansley Park for examples)


Let's Upgrade All Our Streets

Watersheds & Stormwater

North Buckhead is fortunate to enjoy three beautiful streams, providing a wonderful

amenity to our neighborhood. But when a storm hits, these streams can receive more than their share of runoff from roofs and paved surfaces, flooding yards and houses in the process. Further, these streams are damaged by chemicals, sediment, plastics, and other unwanted debris. NBCA's Public Realm and Greenspace Committee has organized an Action Team of interested residents to investigate these topics and pursue next steps.

Our major streams are Little Nancy Creek, Mill Creek, and Nancy Creek. Little Nancy Creek originates in the area near Oglethorpe University and flows along Mountain Drive, Mountain Way, and Wieuca. Mill Creek originates in the highly developed area around Tower Place and flows beside the new Blue Heron Blueway Trail. Nancy Creek originates many miles to the north, collecting stormwater from a wide area.

NBCA's Watershed Action Team is not starting from scratch. Several residents have already been looking into this topic. Sally Silver in Council Member Howard Shook's office has been working with Watershed Management and other agencies about ways to reduce stormwater's impact on the neighborhood. Together, the team hopes to continue the progress on this topic.

IMPROVING PUBLIC SAFETY

Establishing the Public Safety Committee

NBCA plans to create a robust Public Safety Committee. Serving on the Public Safety Committee will be a learning experience due to North Buckhead's unusual public safety complexities and challenges. North Buckhead is Buckhead's largest and most populous neighborhood. It contains busy commercial areas, congested multi-lane roads, 31 miles of neighborhood streets, over 100 streets, and numerous public areas. North Buckhead is part of the Atlanta Police Department's Zone 2 and includes Beat 208 (mostly commercial) and Beat 209 (mostly single-family residential).

The Public Safety Committee will pursue three important activities:

Research and communicate public safety information and resources, including:

- Crime Information
 Downloads from APD
- Recent Crime Incidents& Trends
- Survey Data from Neighborhood Surveys
- Guidance on Deterring Crime (For example: don't leave cash or guns in your car.
 Ten percent of Atlanta car break-ins yield the thief



a gun, creating incentive for future break-ins)

 Legislative Requirements for Citizens (For example, the requirement to register a home security alarm system).

Research and develop proposals for specific safety initiatives, including understanding costs, potential benefits, liability issues, and best practices. This is not to say that programs will be implemented for all potential safety initiatives, but that we will evaluate a number of potential initiatives, including:

- Neighborhood Watch
- Camera Systems
- Security patrol
- Security programs for neighborhood parks
- Home-based camera systems

3 Identify and lobby for action to improve specific concerns, such as:

- Party Houses
- Street Racing
- Illegal Sales & 'Fundraising' at intersections

By virtue of serving on the public safety committee, members will learn about many public safety topics, such as:

- APD Crime Database & Crime Classification System
- APD's Organization& Facilities
- North Buckhead
 Crime Trends
- The 911 & 311 Systems
- APD's VIC Camera Network

More Involvement & Better Operations

NBCA is a 501(c)(4) non-profit association that promotes the common good and general welfare of North Buckhead. We are neighborhood volunteers pitching in to get things done. The NBCA Board has set ambitious goals for membership, volunteers, systems, and the bylaws to help ramp up NBCA's effectiveness.

MEMBERSHIP At the beginning of October 2020, NBCA had approximately 600 members. The Board has launched a major membership effort to increase membership to 1,000 members by the Annual Meeting in March 2021. Why? Because the additional membership will provide needed funds and because a larger membership gives us more clout as we represent the neighborhood with the City and other entities.

VOLUNTEERS The more North Buckhead residents who volunteer, the more impact that NBCA can have. Please contribute your energy and talent to NBCA! The chart on **page 3** and the many 'Call to Volunteer' boxes throughout this publication provide many options for plugging in. We are all busy, so we have created many "bite-size" volunteer opportunities tailored to your interests and availability.

SYSTEMS We recently adopted a state-of-the-art online app to host membership management and the website. The app is called MemberClicks and serves organizations across the country but is located right here in North Buckhead. The app manages member data, automates payments, facilitates communications, and hosts the website. MemberClicks offers additional functionality which we will unveil in the months to come.

BYLAWS Sounds boring, right? But bylaws are actually vital to NBCA conducting business in a businesslike way. As a 'public trust,' it is important for NBCA to follow defined election, voting, and transparency rules. Under the guidance of Lisa Aman, NBCA's Secretary, several bylaw changes were adopted by the membership this past April, strengthening NBCA's committee approach and providing for virtual meetings among several items. Lisa anticipates additional bylaw changes at the Annual Meeting in March 2021.


